



2021-2022 Afterschool Covid Policies & Procedures

We are required to follow the requirements set from the NC Department of Health and Human Services in regard to childcare/afterschool.

Please remember this is a changing environment – I am sure there will be updates and changes as new procedures come from the NCDHHS and we will keep you updated. And hopefully things will begin to change for the better in the months ahead. 😊

- **Carline to pick up**
 - Currently the only people coming into the building are the staff and students.
 - We will give each family 2 hangtags with their family's number to help with the afterschool pick up.

- **Handwashing and hand sanitizer**
 - Students use hand sanitizer after leaving the bus and before entering the building.
 - Students will wash their hands with soap before eating snack.
 - Students use hand sanitizer when they switch to a new area – gym, playground

- **Classes stay contained with just their class**
 - Each class will have their own playground or gym time. And they will stay with only their class throughout the day. If two classes are on the playground at the same time they will stay either in the fenced in area or on the unfenced playground.

- **Cleaning throughout the day**
 - The staff will be spraying the toys, carpet and any used items by the children, each time we transition to a different area.
 - Tables and chairs will be sprayed and wiped down after every use.

- **Face Coverings**
 - Staff and students will wear face coverings when indoors. Students may remove their face coverings while outside.

- **Snack Time / Lunch for camps**
 - Students will eat snack and lunches outside at this time.

- **We will follow the guidance of the Health and Human Services regarding policies if someone is diagnosed or exposed to someone with COVID-19.**
 - For Afterschool we will also follow the quarantine requirements that Easley has in place.

 - Currently if your child or anyone in your household has any of the symptoms below, the symptomatic person will need a negative Covid test before everyone may return to school.
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
 - New cough
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Vomiting

 - If your child or anyone in your household has been exposed to someone diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days:
 - They will be asked to quarantine for 10 days.

 - If anyone in your household is diagnosed with COVID:
 - Follow the guidance from the Health dept. regarding when your child may return to school. It is at least 10 days if the Covid positive person can isolate away from the family. If not, then their 10 days does not start until after the Covid positive person completes their 14 days of isolation.
